

**VICTORIA SANDWICH** 18cm (7") diameter approx.

Do not sugar top. Do not turn out so wire tray marks are visible on the top.

175g (6oz) self-raising flour 175g (6oz) butter or margarine

175g (6oz) caster sugar 3 free-range eggs



# **PLAIN SCONES**

Roll out to approx. 2.5cm (1") thick, cut into rounds with 6cm/2.3in cutter. Milk wash top

450g (1lb) Self-raising flour 100g (3½oz) butter, softened, cut into pieces

2 level tsp baking powder 2 free-range eggs

50g (1¾ oz) caster sugar a little milk
