HORSE SECTION RULES AND CONDITIONS

1. All horses/ponies brought to this Show must be in perfect health and should not have been in contact with any animal suffering from an infection or disease. Stewards are authorised to remove any animal which, in the opinion of the Honorary Veterinary Officer, should not be on the Showground.
2. Protective headgear, with the chin strap securely fastened, must be worn at all times whilst mounted on the showground. Hats must be in accordance with the appropriate affiliated Society's rules and regulations. This rule applies to everyone mounted and will involve disqualification for those who do not comply.
3. All Stallions, 3 years old and over must, at all times, be wearing a bit or chifney whilst moving around the Showground. Stallions must be identified by a blue tail ribbon.
4. No horse should be left unattended unless they are in the horsebox/trailer, and known to behave sensibly when ordinarily left in such a situation

5. Dogs must be kept on non-retractable leads at all times whilst on the showground.
6. All animals will be considered and treated as being in the sole charge and custody of the exhibitor during the whole of the show and every exhibitor or his servant must be in charge of same. The organisers will not be responsible for, or in respect of, any loss, damage, accident or injury, arising from accident or any other cause to any persons, stock, vehicles or equipment.
7. The organisers of this Show have taken reasonable precautions to ensure the health and safety of everyone present. For these measures to be effective, everyone must take all reasonable precautions to avoid and prevent accidents occurring and must obey the instructions of the organisers, officials and stewards.
8. All competitors take part at their own risk. The landowners, organisers, sponsors or officials will not hold themselves responsible for any loss, damage, accident or injury to owners, handlers, spectators, livestock or any property or vehicle, however caused.
9. Objections must be made in writing within one hour of the incident accompanied by a deposit of £20.00 which is returnable if the objection is sustained.
10. Times of classes may vary on the day. Please keep an eye on your ring and check with your ring steward, not the Secretary, as entry fees will not be refunded.
11. Classes will be judged under the relevant affiliated Society's rules and regulations. The judges' decision is final.
12. A Veterinary Surgeon will be available all day on the showground. If, for whatever reason, they may be required please inform a steward and they will get the vet to you (Appointed veterinary surgeons: Tibbs & Simmons – 01934 862808).
13. In the unfortunate event of an animal dying or being destroyed on the Showground, the owner/exhibitor is responsible for the cost of disposal and agrees to indemnify the Society in respect of that cost.
14. The organisers reserve the right to vary the order or composition of the schedule according to circumstances and to substitute other judges from those named, or to make additional appointments as required. The organisers reserve the right to amalgamate or sub-divide any class should numbers entered justify it.
15. The decision of the organisers on any point not covered by the rules is final.
16. Entry fees shall not be returnable except in the following cases:- (a) they will be refunded in the event of cancellation of classes or a DEFRA Order prohibiting the exhibition of animals at the North Somerset Show. (b) in the case of an animal incapacitated by accident, injury or illness. Any claim under this clause must be made in writing to the Secretary and must be accompanied by a certificate issued by a Veterinary Surgeon and to be received not later than 24th April 2023 together with all stickers and passes issued in respect of the entry/ies in question. ANY CLAIM RECEIVED AFTER 24th APRIL 2024 WILL BE INVALID. The entry fee is not returnable to an Exhibitor who enters an animal in a class for which it is ineligible or not registered.
17. Failure to exhibit any animal entered will entail forfeiture of entry fees.
18. All horses attending the Show must have up-to-date vaccinations.
19. All animals ridden anywhere on the Showground, rings or lorry parks (day or night), must only be ridden by a rider whose size and weight does not compromise the animal's welfare. We are operating under the 20% rider weight guideline where the rider in full riding attire with full tack must be less than 20% of the animal's bodyweight. This is based on a relatively fit, healthy animal, as an overweight animal is also a welfare concern.

The North Somerset Show is committed to protecting your personal data and processing it only in accordance with legal requirements. For more details you should request a copy of our GDPR policy.

We process your personal data as it is necessary for the performance of our contract with you to facilitate your entry to the Show.

We will not transfer your data outside of the EEA (European Economic Area) and will not share your data with third parties, except for Breed Societies and/or affiliated Societies and Equine Events, to whom we submit entries and results, to be checked for validity and eligibility based on their legitimate interests. Results will also be circulated with members of the Press and published on our website.

We retain your data in accordance with our retention schedule to simplify future applications.

You have various rights in the data we hold including rectification and objecting to processing.

Please read the rules at the beginning of the horse section. Also:

- i. The North Somerset Show is affiliated to the British Show Jumping and all Show Jumping classes will be judged in accordance with British Show Jumping rules.
- ii. Full entry fees must be remitted with each entry. Refunds will be made in accordance with rule 79.5.
- iii. All entries must include a photocopy of the registration card of the owner, horse and rider.
- iv. Entries in classes 300-306 are confined to registered horses to be ridden by members in accordance with rule 79.
- v. Rule 82.21: "No member shall allow a stallion for which he/she is responsible as owner, lessee, authorised agent or rider to attend a show, compete or be prepared to compete in any show jumping competition without taking adequate precautions to ensure other horses/ponies, competitors and members of the public are not put at risk of injury."
- vi. When jumping in the Ring, the practice or collecting areas, all Riders must wear protective headgear, according to the current standards as listed below:
All PAS 015; VG1; (BS)EN1384 2017; ASTM F1163 04a onwards; SNELL E2001; SNELL E2016; AS/NZS 3838 2003 onwards; Skullcaps must be of, or worn with, a dark coloured plain peaked cover. Refer to your Society/ Association Rule Book for further clarification.
Correctly secured Skull Caps/Riding Hats that meet one of the following current Safety Standards/specifications MUST be worn by all Riders between the ages of 15 to 17 inclusive. All PAS 015; VG1; (BS) EN1384 2017; ASTM F1163 04a onwards; SNELL E2001; SNELL E2016; AS/NZS 3838 2003 onwards. The most recent updates to the list are the addition of SNELL E2016 and EN1384 (2017); the newest version of the SNELL Standard could have begun to appear in 2017 and is accepted to the list; the newest version of the EN1384 Standard will begin to appear during 2018 and is also accepted to the list.

300 Senior Newcomers Championships - First Round/ 1.10m Open

Starting time 8.30am

DRAWN ORDER – order will be emailed to competitors.

Rule 312. Table A7. Speed 325mpm. Start Height 1.10m.

Newcomers:

(a) For registered horses in Grade C that have not won a total of 375 points. Four double clears will qualify - in accordance with rule 312.6

(b) For all horses born on or after 1st January 2018, irrespective of Points. Horses will only be eligible for double clear qualification to Second Rounds if they reach the age of six years or under in the same calendar year as the Newcomers Final - in accordance with Rule 312.6.

Four double clears will qualify for the Senior Newcomers Second Rounds. Qualifying period: 1st May 22 – 30th April inclusive. If combined with an open: In the event of 30 or more starters the class will be split with two sets of prize money.

1.10m Open: For registered horses ridden by Adult, Associate or Junior Members.

Entry fee: £25 per horse

Table A4. Speed 350mpm. Start Height 1.15m. Rule - 76.6.

Open to all registered horses to be ridden by Adult, Associate or Junior Members. Those riders not listed on the British Showjumping Gold League as of 31st March 2022 will be eligible to qualify for the National 1.15m Members Cup Final. Qualifies for: British Showjumping National Championships. Qualification period: 1st June-31st May.

Numbers to qualify: Two double clears (subject to revision). Qualification is horse/rider combination. Double clear qualifications will not be obtained from one round competitions (e.g. Table A4 or Table A (1 Round)).

Entry fee: £30 per horse

Prizes: 1st: £500.00, 2nd: £400.00, 3rd: £300.00, 4th: £200.00, 5th: £100.00, 6th: £30.00

302 Senior Foxhunter Championship – First Round / 1.20m OPEN

Rule 310. Table A7. Speed 350mpm. Start Height 1.20m. Rule 76.6.

In the event of 30 or more starters the class will be split and two sets of prize money awarded. Horses (or ponies in pony competitions) may compete in one section only. In the event of insufficient entries lower prizes will be withheld.

Foxhunter:

(a) For registered horses in Grade C that have not won a total of 700 points. Four double clears will qualify - in accordance with rule 310.6

(b) For all registered horses born on or after 1 January 2017, irrespective of points. Horses will be eligible for double clear qualification to attend second rounds providing they reach the age of seven years or under in the same calendar year as the Foxhunter Final - in accordance with rule 310.6 Four double clears will qualify.

Four double clears will qualify for the Senior Foxhunter Second Rounds. Qualifying period: The Senior Foxhunter Second Round qualifying period for the 2023 second rounds is 1 May – 30 April (subject to revision).

Rule 102.16 British Showjumping hind boot rule for boots/leg protection applies in this class. Those horses that have qualified for the Senior Foxhunter Championship in 2024 are not eligible for qualification to the 2025 Championship. If combined with an open: In the event of 30 or more starters the class will be split with two sets of prize money.

1.20m Open: For registered horses ridden by Adult, Associate or Junior Members.

Entry fee: £25 per horse

Prizes: 1st: £200, 2nd: £150.00, 3rd: £100.00, 4th: £75.00, 5th: £50.00, 6th: £25.00

Open to registered horses to be ridden by Adult, Associate and Junior Members.

Qualifies for: The British Showjumping National Championships.

Qualifying period: 1st July- 30th June.

Numbers to qualify: Two double clears to qualify to the final. Double clear qualifications will not be obtained from one round competitions (e.g. Table A4 or Table A (1 Round)).

Entry fee: £50 per horse

Prizes: 1st: £1,000, 2nd: £800.00, 3rd: £600.00, 4th: £400.00, 5th: £200.00, 6th: £50.00

For registered horses in Grades: A, B & C. Ridden by Adult, Associate or Junior Members who will be aged 12 years or over in the current calendar year. In the event of insufficient entries lower prizes will be withheld.

Class 306 will run in the Main Ring at the provisional time of 13.30.

306 Six bars

Rule 279. Table A. Speed 0mpm. Start Height 1.00m. Rule 76.6.

For registered horses to be ridden by Adult, Associate or Junior Members.

The course for this competition comprises six vertical obstacles placed in a straight line with two non-jumping strides between each obstacle. In indoor arenas the first two obstacles may be placed on one straight line and the last four obstacles on a different straight line. The top element and fill of each obstacle must be poles only.

No obstacle may be set at a lower height than the obstacle preceding it.

The competition is judged under Table A not against the clock with a time limit of two minutes. In the event of a disobedience, the competitor must restart the course at the obstacle where the error occurred, but may make his/her approach at an angle from outside the space between the obstacles and is not required or allowed to take any of the previous obstacles again.

If an obstacle is disturbed as the result of a disobedience, the procedure in Rule 251.4 must be applied, but no time penalty is incurred.

In the event of equality of faults for first place there will be up to four successive jumps-off not against the clock. The first jump-off must be over all six obstacles, but the course may be reduced progressively for each further jump-off to a minimum of three obstacles by removing in succession first, second and third obstacles.

The Judge at his/her discretion may terminate the competition after the third jump-off. In the event of equality of faults in the final jump-off competitors are placed equal and divide the prize money.

Competitors who withdraw from or retire during a jump-off are placed equal with those who are eliminated in the same jump-off (Rules 203, 204).

- ii. The South West Shetland Pony Group will present a special rosette to the highest placed pony owned by a Member in each class. Current Membership cards **MUST** be produced in the ring.
- iii. This Show is affiliated to the Shetland Pony Stud-Book Society; Classes must be confined to registered ponies. Ponies must be named on the entry form and in the catalogue. Society rosettes will only be given to ponies registered with the Stud-Book Society or foals eligible for registration. Three-year-old fillies with foals may not be shown. All foals must be a minimum of three weeks old on the day of the Show. Ridden stallions **MUST** display a stallion bridle badge. In-hand stallions 2 years and over are advised to display a stallion bridle badge.
- iv. Exhibitors under 14 yrs old may not show colts (excluding foals) or entire males in In-hand classes. Exhibitors under 12 yrs old on the day of the Show may not show entire males in ridden classes. Exhibitors should not kneel but remain standing while in the ring. Hard hats must be worn by all exhibitors, irrespective of age, in ridden classes. Ridden ponies must be 4 years old or over. In ridden classes, if a rider falls off at any time whilst in the ring, both pony and rider must leave the ring, rider dismounted, and take no further part.
- v. In the interest of safety, hard hats must be worn by all Exhibitors aged 14 years of age or under in In-hand classes.
- vi. The Shetland Pony Stud-Book Society will award rosettes to the Senior Champion & Reserve, Miniature Champion & Reserve, Standard Shetland Champion & Reserve, Junior Shetland Champion & Reserve and Best Open Ridden
- vii. **Classes 307-312** to be shown in-hand

MOUNTAIN AND MOORLAND

These classes are judged under the Rules of the NPS. Ponies must be registered in the main body of their respective Mountain & Moorland Stud Books. Part-breds are not eligible for Mountain & Moorland Classes.

Qualifying rounds for most NPS competitions are open to ponies owned by NPS members and non-members. Owners of qualified ponies must become adult **Qualifying or Life** members to enter the final of the competition at the NPS Summer Championship Show at Malvern from **6th – 8th August 2024**.

The highest placed pony in each class will qualify for the final. Qualification may pass down to third place if the first and second ponies are already qualified.

This Show offers qualification for **The National Welsh Championship Show on 11th August 2024 at Three Counties Showground, Malvern**. See Sections relevant to registered Welsh breeds (In Hand & Ridden) for qualification details. Qualifiers will be directly contacted after this show with details of qualification and entry details. For Show Details and Schedule see our Facebook page.

NPS/Corscaron Horse Essentials Home Produced Ridden Championship - Riders of Home Produced ponies (see definition in the NPS Rules Book) can wear a white arm band in classes where this is indicated. These ponies are then eligible to qualify for the final at the NPS Summer Championship Show. The Owner's Membership cards **MUST** be produced in the ring when requested or the qualification will be forfeit.

- i. The North Somerset Show is affiliated to the National Pony Society and all classes will be judged under the rules and jurisdiction of the Society. Copies of the rules can be obtained from the NPS.
 - ii. These classes are qualifiers for **The NPS/Ashbourne M&M In Hand Summer Championship to be held at Malvern 6th – 8th August 2024**. These classes are open to pure bred registered M&M ponies in the main body of their studbook. Owners membership cards must be shown in the ring to receive qualifications. Foals are not eligible.
 - iii. These classes are qualifiers for the **Equifest Mountain & Moorland In Hand**. The **two** highest placed exhibits not already qualified will qualify for the relevant Equifest Championship to be held at Arena UK, Grantham, Lincolnshire on the **1st – 4th August 2024**.

- i. All those entering horses and/or participating in the show agree to be bound by the Retraining of Racehorses Rules and Regulations from time to time in force. All entrants must have current RoR competition membership (www.ror.co.uk)
- ii. Competitors must wear a safety/kit mark hard hat with chinstrap and any grooms coming into the ring must also wear a suitable hard hat.
- iii. Class **357** is a qualifier for the Open re-trained race horse. The **two** highest placed exhibits not already qualified will qualify for the relevant Equifest Championship to be held at Arena UK, Grantham, Lincolnshire on the **1st – 4th August 2024**.

357 TATTERSALLS RoR AMATEUR RIDDEN SHOW SERIES QUALIFIER

Open to all RoR and NR competition registered horses, 4yrs and over, mares and geldings, owned, produced and ridden by an Amateur. Riders must be 15 years or over on the 1st January of the calendar year holding the classes. Horses should be ridden in a snaffle, Pelham or simple double bridle with a plain cavesson noseband. Horses should be plaited. The Series is open to AMATEUR riders only – those employed in racing will be allowed to compete. Class will be judged under 'riding horse' format without 'type' being taken into consideration. Racing injuries and blemishes ARE IGNORED in this series. The Judge will not ride at the qualifiers but will ride in the Final. Competitors/handlers/grooms must wear a safety/kite mark hard hat with a chinstrap.

The first three go forward to the final at the Hickstead Derby Meeting June 22nd 2024

RoR rosettes 1st – 4th and a branded prize to the winner. The winner also qualifies for the Tattersalls RoR Amateur Ridden Show Series Special at the Jockey Club RoR National Championships at Aintree on 24th August 2024.

If sufficient entries, the class may be split into National Hunt and Flat at the organisers' and RoR's discretion. Both sections will qualify.

Amateur definition: The rules are as in the rulebook with the following addition that an amateur may not show a horse owned or sponsored by a company or commercial firm. In addition, a person classed as amateur must not be supported by a company in any way or act as brand ambassador whether financially or in-kind. An amateur is a person who for the purpose of RoR classes does not/has not during the current season or previous season: Engage (d) in breeding, livery, buying or selling, dealing or hiring horses in a commercial capacity. Horses must not have been stabled at or reside in a Professional Producer's/Trainer's yard from January 1st, 2024. Riders must not have ridden any animals produced by a Professional/Trainer in the current or previous season. Horses and riders must not receive any help from a Professional Producer/Trainer at a SHOW in the current season. A rider who has ridden for a Professional/Producer Trainer in the current or previous season must not have ridden horses at a show. Any breaches of this ruling will be taken seriously and will result in disqualification from future classes.
